VMS RESOLUTION 1 PAIN TREATMENT AND ASSESSMENT 2 3 Adopted at 191st VMS Annual Meeting, October 23, 2004 4 5 WHEREAS, VMS has had a longstanding commitment to improving pain treatment 6 and end-of-life care in Vermont and is actively engaged in promoting initiatives that 7 assure all dying Vermonters receive good, comprehensive care; and 8 9 WHEREAS, VMS supports improving the quality of care through the establishment of 10 public - private partnerships that include physicians and state government designed to 11 improve quality of medical care including pain assessment and treatment; and 12 13 WHEREAS, pain management is an integral aspect of quality medical care; and 14 15 WHEREAS, all practicing clinicians need to know how to assess and treat pain; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Assessment of pain involves a complex evaluation of subjective symptoms 18 that cannot be measured objectively; and 19 20 WHEREAS, treatment of pain requires multi-disciplinary involvement of physicians 21 22 and other practitioners and drug and non-drug treatment; and 23 WHEREAS, treatment planning and goal setting for patients with pain at the end of life 24 differs from patients with chronic pain not associated with life-threatening illness; and 25 26 WHEREAS, pain medications with potential for abuse and diversion may be the only 27 effective treatment for some patients in pain; and 28 29 WHEREAS physicians must constantly balance the potential for improving pain care 30 through greater availability of effective analgesic medications with the risks of harm to 31 both patients and to society through diversion and abuse of prescription medications; 32 therefore be it 33 34 RESOLVED, that VMS renew its commitment to work to improve the treatment 35 36 and assessment of pain; and be it further 37 RESOLVED, that VMS work with the Vermont Program for Quality in Health 38 Care (VPQHC), consistent with available funding, to evaluate the current status 39 40 of pain treatment and end-of-life care in Vermont; and be it further 41 RESOLVED, that VMS work with VPQHC, consistent with available funding, 42 to ensure that appropriate guidelines for the treatment and assessment of pain, 43 based on national and internationally recognized standards, are recommended for 44 use in Vermont; and be it further 45

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RESOLVED, that the VMS work with the University of Vermont's College of 1 Medicine (UVMCOM) to evaluate the current status of education for medical 2 students and residents in Vermont on the issue of pain treatment and end-of-life 3 care; and be it further 4 5 RESOLVED, that, based on VPQHC and UVMCOM studies, the VMS work to 6 ensure that appropriate education and resources are available to improve 7 treatment and assessment of pain in Vermont; and be it further 8 9 RESOLVED, that the VMS work with state agencies and the law enforcement 10 community to ensure that all parties are aware of the proper use and potential for 11 abuse of pain medications; and be it further 12 13 RESOLVED, that the VMS work to increase understanding of the differences 14 involved in treating pain at the end of life, as opposed to treating chronic or acute 15 pain experienced by patients who are not dying; and be it further 16 17 RESOLVED, that the VMS work to ensure that Vermont physicians are informed 18 about the Policy of the Vermont Board of Medical Practice on Chronic Pain 19 Management. 20 21
